




NOVEMBER

DAILY READINGS

As we finish our “In Spirit and In Truth” series, we are going to continue looking at the work of the Holy Spirit in the Early Church throughout the book of Acts, as well as exploring various other texts from the Bible that speak to this topic. We recommend you use a journal to write down your answers to the questions included with the daily readings. Before your reading each day, meditate on 1 Cor.14:33 , pray for one person to know Christ  and one person to grow in Him .

Memorization & Meditation:

“For God is not a God of confusion but peace.” - 1 Cor.14:33

Sunday, October 27th

- [Nov 1] Acts 21:1-16 | Have you ever allowed the threat of persecution or suffering prevent you from following what you believe God is telling you to do? What was Paul’s response?
- [2] Acts 21:17-36 | The Jews were upset because Paul brought Greeks (“sinners”) into the temple (v.28). How can you intentionally reach out to someone who does not know Jesus this week?

Sunday, November 3rd

- [4] Acts 21:37-22:21 | Paul was persistent in the way he unceasingly reached out to the Jews with the gospel. In what area of your life do you need to persist? Pray for strength.
- [5] Acts 22:22-29 | Paul’s treatment changed immediately upon the realization that he was a Roman citizen. Read Phil. 3:20-21 and spend time today reflecting on the truth that you are a citizen of heaven, adopted into God’s family.
- [6] Acts 22:30-23:11 | The Lord “stood by” Paul and encouraged him. Have you ever felt encouragement from Jesus through a specific situation? Pray that you would experience this more.
- [7] Acts 23:12-35 | God was protecting Paul through his nephew (v.16), not through Paul’s own doing. Spend time thanking God for His protection and provision.
- [8] Acts 24:1-21 | Paul’s only confession before the council was that he worships and hopes in God. Is your hope in God the driving force of your life?
- [9] Acts 24:22-27 | Paul was in prison at Caesarea two years! Are you willing to be jailed for Christ? Spend time praying for perseverance for the trials you are currently enduring. Also pray that if God were to give these extraordinary circumstances that He would preserve and strengthen you!

Sunday, November 10th

- [11] Acts 25:1-12 | What is really holding you back from courageous faith and bold obedience like Paul’s?
- [12] Acts 25:13-27 | The hardships Paul encountered in his life never seemed to slow him down. Why was this?
- [13] Acts 26:1-11 | Read 2 Cor. 5:17. Paul is a new creation in Jesus Christ and is washed free of the sins of his former life. Spend time thanking God that the same is true of all Christians.
- [14] Acts 26:12-32 | How do you react when people respond negatively to you? What can you learn from Paul’s response to Festus and Agrippa?
- [15] Acts 27:1-12 | Have you ever listened to the wrong people and made a decision you regretted? How has God been faithful to you in spite of that decision?
- [16] Acts 27:13-44 | All the lives on the ship were spared due to Paul’s wisdom, which came from God. How has God proven trustworthy in your life?

Sunday, November 17th

- [18] Acts 28:1-10 | Two miracles take place in these ten verses! Spend time today praying for healing for someone that you know is suffering. Continue to follow up with that person and remain attuned to the potential of God’s healing power.
- [19] Acts 28:11-31 | Think back over the life of Paul – how is he remembered? How do you want to be remembered? Are your current actions leading toward that legacy?
- [20] 1 Cor. 12:1-11 | Re-read v.4-6. All gifts are empowered by God. What spiritual gift has been most evident in your life, and how is it clear that this is empowered by the Spirit and is for the common good? (v.7) If you have trouble identifying your owns giftings, ask someone close to you, that you trust, what they see in you.
- [21] 1 Cor. 12:12-20 | Are there others in the body of Christ that you look down upon because of their gifts or the way they were created? Spend time considering and repenting.
- [22] 1 Cor. 12:21-31 | Thank God for the unity of diversity in the body of Christ. What is one thing you can do this week to promote unity in your church?
- [23] 1 Cor. 13:1-7 | Paul tells us to earnestly desire spiritual gifts (12:31, 14:1), but also says that without love, we are nothing. How can you use your spiritual giftings to love others?

Sunday, November 24th

- [25] 1 Cor. 13:8-13 | Why does Paul say that love never ends (v.8) and that the greatest of love, faith, and hope, is love? (v.13)
- [25] 1 Cor. 14:1-12 | Look over your notes from our teachings on tongues and prophecy (November 3 & 10). Based on your notes, define prophecy and tongues.
- [26] 1 Cor. 14:13-25 | Based on v.1-25, define ‘speaking in tongues’ and ‘prophecy’. Which one are we to desire more? What are the appropriate and inappropriate uses of each?
- [27] 1 Cor. 14:26-40 | Re-read v.33. Have you ever seen spiritual gifts lead to confusion? How could that situation have resulted in peace instead?
- [28] Recite the memory verse from September – Acts 1:8, and reflect on your notes from the September daily readings.
- [29] Recite the memory verse from October – Acts 20:24, and reflect on your notes from the October daily readings.
- [30] Recite the memory verse from November – 1 Cor 14:33, and reflect on your notes from the November daily readings.
