## DAILY READINGS

“Revive us” is a heart cry to the Lord for a renewed connection with Him. It is what happens when a follower of Jesus experiences a surge of Life and a church experiences an overflow of God’s presence into the Community. In this series we will learn about the heart conditions that God is looking for as He responds in revival and how they are displayed throughout the book of 2nd Chronicles. We will then ask the Lord to shape our hearts and to revive us again! Before your reading each day, meditate on Isaiah 43:19 , pray for one person to know Christ  and pray for one person to grow in Him .

### Memorization & Meditation:

*“If my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and I will heal their land” 2 Chronicles 7:14*

### WEEK 1

#### Sunday, January 26th

[Feb 1] 2 Chronicles 7:14 | What do you think it looks like to humble yourself before the Lord?

### WEEK 2

#### Sunday, February 2nd

- [3] Psalm 85:1-13 | What stands out to you as you read this psalm?
- [4] Isaiah 57:14-15 | Read Psalm 51:16 also. God cares about the postures of our heart. Pray & ask God to reveal your heart posture before him today.
- [5] Genesis 35:1-8 | What did Jacob’s household do before the protection of God went before them?
- [6] Genesis 35:9-15 | God blesses Jacob abundantly in response to him turning away from idols. What idols are in your life?
- [7] 1 Samuel 7:1-13 | What similarities do you see between this passage and the Genesis 35 passage?
- [8] Spend time reflecting on what you read this week & ask the Holy Spirit to use it to revive your heart & mind.

### WEEK 3

#### Sunday, February 9th

- [10] Psalm 85:1-13 | It’s obvious the psalmist wanted to hear from the Lord (v.8) and see Him move (v.7). Spend time reflecting on whether your heart desires this same thing and pray for more of it.
- [11] Exodus 32:1-14 | Moses’ conversation (prayer) results in mercy for the Israelites, what a change! Reflect on a time when you saw prayer bring dramatic change to a situation in your life.
- [12] Exodus 32:15-35 | We often downplay the seriousness of our sins. How does Moses’ response to the sins of the people challenge your own attitude towards your sin?
- [13] Exodus 33:1-11 | The Israelites lost the presence of God because of their sin (v.1-3). Can you think of a time when you felt your sin created a break in your fellowship with God?
- [14] Exodus 33:12-23, 34:1-9 | After seeing His people’s repentance (33:4) and prayer, God decides to accompany the Israelites with His presence once more (33:15-17). Is there any sin you need to repent of and take to the Lord in prayer?
- [15] Spend time reflecting on what you read this week & ask the Holy Spirit to use it to revive your heart & mind.

### WEEK 4

#### Sunday, February 16th

- [17] Psalm 85:1-13 | Put yourself into the Psalm and read it again. Ask God to restore you again.
- [18] 1 Kings 18:1-19 | Elijah was bold in his messages from God to Obadiah and Ahab. Reflect upon a time when the Lord called you to be courageous or bold.
- [19] 1 Kings 18:20-29 | How do you feel reading about the empty worship and crying out to Baal? Have you ever tried to replace God with empty things?
- [20] 1 Kings 18:30-40 | How did Elijah’s sacrifice compare to the sacrifice to Baal? How did the people respond?
- [21] 1 Kings 18:41-46 | After the sacrifice is accepted & the people repent, God sends rain (his blessing). What aspects of the Gospel do you see in this story?
- [22] Spend time reflecting on what you read this week & ask the Holy Spirit to use it to revive your heart & mind.

### WEEK 5

#### Sunday, February 23rd

- [24] Psalm 85:1-13 | How does the Lord’s steadfast love and forgiveness change us (v.7)?
- [25] 2 Chron. 29:1-19 | King Hezekiah’s first act as king was to restore the temple for worship. What would it look like for you to restore an area of your spiritual life that may not be as vibrant right now?
- [26] 2 Chron. 29:20-36 | Israel turned abruptly from their sin. When was the last time you turned from sin and sought the Lord?
- [27] 2 Chron. 30:1-9 | Read verse nine again. What comfort does this truth give you?
- [28] 2 Chron. 30:10-22 | God healed the people after Hezekiah’s prayer (v.20). Spend time in prayer asking God for spiritual healing and revival.
- [29] Spend time reflecting on what you read this week & ask the Holy Spirit to use it to revive your heart & mind.
